Located 2 minutes southwest of Gimli, off Minerva Road, the Manitoba Karting Association (MKA) runs 10 races per year from May to September. MKA offers senior and junior classes with drivers of all ages. Spectators are always welcome. Admission is free!


Typically, Saturdays are testing (practice) days and Sundays are Race Days, rain or shine.

On test days, drivers tune the kart and make sure every part is safe and competition ready before entering Sunday's race.

The track, at 800 metres long, has many challenging turns with a straight section where our adult class karts can reach speeds of 130km/hr.

# GETTING STARTED



## #3 TOOLS

You will need a kart stand for your kart to sit on while you work on it and to roll it to and from the grid area. Hand tools such as sockets, wrenches, and screwdrivers are a must for maintenance. A fuel jug and tire compressor are also must-haves. We also recommend a table or similar work surface, and a pop-up tent to give you shade during the race day.

## #1 KART

Most drivers start out with used karts. You can find reasonably priced used karts fairly easily as drivers will often upgrade every few years and sell their older kart. If you are unsure of what to buy or have questions about where to purchase a kart, we can help!

## SAFETY EQUIPMENT #2

Drivers are required to wear the appropriate safety equipment regulated by ASN (the national governing body for karting in Canada) when competing. These consist of: Regulation helmet, race suit, racing shoes (or running shoes), rib protector, neck guard, and gloves. Used equipment is often available for sale as many drivers may grow out of pieces long before they wear out.
